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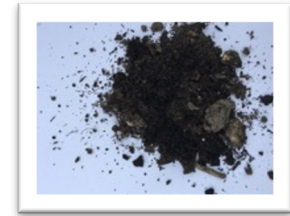


Bright ideas

or choose your own!

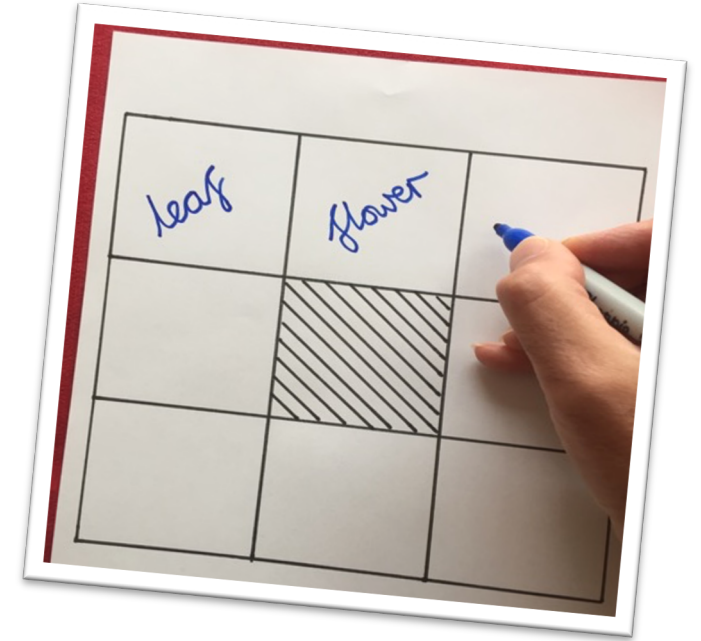


Try ordering them into the 8 boxes in the grid below so that there is a link between the 3 items in each row, and a link between the 3 items in each column.

You can write the name of each item in the boxes, or print and cut out the photos, or even use real objects from your own house and garden.

Top Tips:

- Remember there are many 'right' answers – it's all about being able to explain your links to someone else.
- You might think about the appearance of each item, where it is found, what it is made from, whether it is living or dead, what it is used for... What is the same, what is different?
- It's useful to be able to change the order of the items as you think about your links.
